

## FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: ALL STATE GOLF TEAMS

Laney Frye repeats as Ms. Golf, Jay Nimmo named 2019 Mr. Golf; Boys and Girls All State Teams Announced

LOUISVILLE - Lexington Christian Academy senior Laney Frye repeated as Kentucky's Ms. Golf for the 2019 season, while Marshall County junior Jay Nimmo earned honors as Kentucky's 2019 Mr. Golf with the All-State First & Second Team announced by Golf House Kentucky and the Kentucky Golf Coaches Association.

Frye totaled 925 points to become the first repeat winner as Ms. Golf since Lydia Gumm of North Hardin did so from 2010 to 2012. Frye was also a member of the All-State First Team in 2017. She secured the Ms. Golf Award by finishing as the runner up of the 2019 Leachman Buick-GMC-Cadillac KHSAA State Championship. During the regular season, Frye won four tournaments and finished tied for runner up in the KGCA All State Championship. This year's runner-up was junior Faith Martin (South Warren High School), who finished 35 points behind Frye with a total of 890 points, and also finished tied for second at the KGCA All State Championship and concluded her season by finishing third in the KHSAA State Championship.

Nimmo totaled 915 points to leave him 110 points ahead of runner up senior Drew Doyle (St Xavier High School) using totals from the best seven All-State Point Invitational results during the regular season plus placement in the Regional and State Tournaments. Nimmo completed his season by winning the 2019 Leachman Buick-GMC-Cadillac KHSAA State Championship.. During the season, Nimmo finished with ten Top 10 finishes in Invitational tournaments with four wins while finishing fourth in the KGCA All State Championship and winning the Boys Region 1 Championship. This is the second time Nimmo has earned a spot on the First Team. Doyle finished as Runner Up in the KGCA All State Championship and concluded his season with a fourth place finish at the KHSAA State Championship as well.

The All State Golf First and Second Teams are chosen by points earned in high school invitationals, KGCA All State Championships, Regional Tournaments and the KHSAA State Championship. Invitationals submit their results to the All-State Points Committee comprised of Directors from Golf House Kentucky, the Kentucky Golf Coaches Association, and boys and girls high school coaches.

The First Team players and coaches will be honored at the All-State Banquet on Sunday, November 3 at Keene Trace Golf Club (Champions Course). The banquet is sponsored by the Kentucky PGA Junior Tour (Golf House Kentucky) and the Kentucky Golf Coaches Association (KGCA).
