The Kentucky Golf Coaches Association (KGCA) is excited to announce its 2020 class of the KGCA Coaches Hall of Fame, which will be inducted on Sunday, September 20, 2020 during the KGCA All State Championships, held at the University of Kentucky Club in Lexington.

The KGCA will honor several coaches each year who have made significant contributions to the game of high school golf in Kentucky, and has chosen five individuals for this class who have helped to lead the way in making high school golf in the Commonwealth such an outstanding sport. This group was chosen by the Hall of Fame committee earlier this fall and will be honored during the ceremony on Sunday. This year's class will include:

John Kahl, Trinity

Kahl was head coach of the Trinity golf program from 1979 to 1992, and assistant in 1978. During his tenure, Trinity won 4 state championships (1978, 1979, 1988, 1990), was runner up one year, and third place 3 times. His teams qualified for the state tournament 10 times, winning 7 regional championships. John taught at Trinity for 40 years, and has also served as a KGA rules official for 27 years, working the KHSAA state tournament 25 times.

Bunny Daugherty, Sacred Heart

Daugherty was the head coach for Sacred Heart golf for 25 years, part of the 49 years she spent as a coach at Sacred Heart. Her teams won 5 state championships (1984, 1985, 1986, 1987, 1993) and 14 regional championships. Altogether her teams at Sacred Heart won 13 state championships in four different sports, and the Sacred Heart Bunny Daugherty Invitational is held each year in her memory. She is a member of the KHSAA Hall of Fame, and the Kentucky Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame.

Lou Brown, Jessamine County/West Jessamine

Brown was the head coach at Jessamine County and West Jessamine for 29 years, from 1972 to 2001, and her teams participated in 15 state tournaments during that time. She began the girls golf program in 1972 after Title IX established girls sports programs. She was the regional manager for her region for nearly three decades, and served as manager of the girls state golf tournament from 1984 to 2004. She has been recognized by the KHSSA as outstanding golf official in 1994, and was recognized again by the KHSAA for her work and dedication to girls golf.

Nancy Ragland, Paducah Tilghman

Ragland was the head coach of the Paducah Tilghman boys golf team from 1995 to 2006, and also coached the school's girls golf team from 2002-2006. In 2000, she became the first female coach to have a boys team win the state golf championship, and her team followed this with runner up and third place finishes the next two seasons. During her tenure, the boys golf program qualified for 7 state tournaments, with 4 regional championships in a row from 2000-2003. She was named Kentucky Boys Golf Coach of the Year in 2000, 2001 and 2005, Mideast Coach of the Year in 2000 and 2005, and was a finalist for National Coach of the year in 2006.

Chris Adams, Central Hardin

Adams was the head coach of the boys and girls teams at Central Hardin from 2002-2014. His girls teams won state championships in 2005 and 2006, and runners up in 2004 and 2007. Central Hardin girls teams won 8 regional championships between 2003-2011, and the boys won a regional championship in 2011. The Central Hardin girls qualified for the state tournament every year he was coaching. Adams has hosted the Lady Bruin Invitational since 2003, was a regional manager for boys and girls tournaments 14 times, and was one of the founding members of the KGCA, where he currently serves as Secretary.
